PARALEGAL POSITION

Greater Boston Legal Services (GBLS) has a position for a paralegal in the Employment Law Unit to represent low-wage workers, including Limited English Proficient (LEP) clients, with unemployment insurance (UI) cases and to coordinate the unit's hiring and supervision of student interns and volunteers handling these cases.

Job duties include:

- Representing clients in UI cases at the Department of Unemployment Assistance, and potentially in appeals to the Board of Review, under the supervision of a Senior Attorney.
- Reviewing, evaluating, and in some situations initiating UI case intakes to determine which cases should be referred and which should be handled in-house, including identifying cases important to systemic advocacy goals.
- Hiring, training, and supervising students and volunteers, including preparing training materials, overseeing intake and case-handling assignments, and assisting in evaluations.

Qualifications: The paralegal should have: 1) experience with and/or commitment to working with LEP low-income clients; 2) excellent oral and written communication skills; and 3) the ability to supervise students. Experience representing clients in adversarial (2-party) administrative hearings is preferred but not required. Proficiency in Spanish or another language spoken by GBLS clients desired.

The salary for this position is based on a union scale. GBLS offers a generous benefits package, retirement contribution and generous PTO leave.
